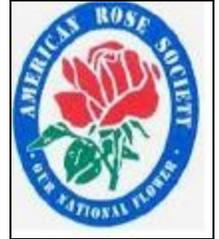

Plan Ahead for Spring

With the cold weather we have been having, our thoughts turn to warmer weather and thoughts of gardening and working in our roses. We think about what we would like to add to our rose collection. Now is a good time to look over your rose supplies. Check out your sprays to see what you need. Check the dates on the bottles. If it is over three years old it needs to be discarded properly and replaced. In the District seminars you will learn the proper method of discarding out of date sprays.

Watch your store ads. Some stores will offer discounts on early season purchases. Check your equipment such as sprayers for proper operation. There is nothing more aggravating than to mix up a tank of spray and discover your sprayer is clogged or doesn't work at all.

Check your pruners. Do they need to be sharpened and do they operate properly. I sharpen mine several times during the season. Good sharp pruners will give a good clean cut and not damage the cane.

Do you have a supply of rose foods? I will not go into the debate between organic and chemical. I use primarily organic and a little chemical mixed in.

Do not start your pruning too early. I do not start until after the first of April. Pruning promotes new growth and you do not want that to start too early. A freeze back after pruning could set your roses back for weeks.

Watering is not limited to the growing season. If it gets dry in the winter months you will need to do some watering. With the temperatures as low as we have had that may not be possible.

Think Spring, think warm, dream of roses. The winter will pass.
